## Update from the Butterfly and Sunflower Rooms

The children in Butterfly Room are being very helpful by helping to set the table ready for mealtimes. Whilst the children are helping to set the table, they are involved in counting how



many plates and bowls we need for each meal. They are learning how to carry the crockery and glasses safely and where to put the cutlery in relation to the plate or bowl. We also enjoy talking about what food might be served at the meal and what their favourite meal is at home.

It may only look like the children are setting the table but there is a whole lot of learning going on! We are sure they will be keen to practice their new skills at your dining table too!



We have been working closely with Sunflower Room so that the new children moving up to us no longer need a dummy or a bottle of milk whilst at nursery. We have also supported the children already in Butterfly Room to move away from these comforters during the day and all of the teachers have noticed how much more the children are talking. There is a constant hum of chatter around the classroom which is great to hear.

To help with talking and listening the children recently reorganised the book corner and picked out some bear stories to go alongside our Goldilocks and the 3 Bears story. We have also introduced story spoon props to go alongside our stories. By using story spoons to accompany a well know story encourages the child to deepen their understanding and love of books and helps bring the books to life. It also helps to develop their vocabulary when the children join in with parts of the story. They can then learn to recite longer phrases of the story and then add in their own imagination and opinions

### What's Growing at Always Growing?

We are very pleased with our new garden where we can exercise, explore and experiment.

It's a lovely space to discover plants, trees and wildlife. We can wonder about the weather and spot insects, birds and animals. We can play on the tyre swing, run around or just sit and enjoy being outside.

We have three big raised beds to grow vegetables, fruit and flowers. We have already planted 100 daffodil bulbs which

are sleeping until the spring time. If we managed to put them in the right way up, we should have a colourful display in the spring time. We hope the squirrels won't dig them up; we found that they had buried lots of acorns in our soil which we learned they will dig up in the winter to provide much needed food when nothing is growing.



We have grown some wildflowers too. Our favourites are the pink clover and the ragged robin. They attracted bees and butterflies in the warmer weather but now they attract Daddy Long Legs and some sleepy wasps.

We have planted some herbs and strawberries and we look forward to watching them grow and tasting them. We

have some colourful pansies and violas too which smell lovely. Look out for them when you call.

We are having fun linking our outdoor activities to indoor ones: each month we are finding out about a different plant. This month, we are tasting, touching and smelling the herbs we are growing.

We can test the natural things we find in the garden like leaves and sticks: do they float or sink ? Do they absorb water? How do they grow? We can do some art activities too like leaf printing and collages.

Do come and enjoy our garden as we do.

# Looking forwards...

We have some exciting events lined up over the next few weeks in the nursery. Find out what we will be getting up to below:

•14 October ~ **National Library Day** gives us the opportunity to celebrate books and role-play. We will read different books throughout the week and encourage children to retell stories in their play.

•16 October ~ **World Food Day**, the children will get to explore a variety of foods from different cultures and backgrounds

•21 October ~ **Apple day** which marks the importance of nature, spreading the environmental awareness and a great extension to our garden project. The children's fine motor and hand strength will be challenged as they chop and prepare some apples to make some apple crumble.

•28 October ~ **Diwali** festival and celebration of light. The children will be crafting diyas (tea light candle holders) and practicing their mark making skills by creating their own rangoli prints (traditional Indian prints). We will also be experimenting with the concept of light and dark, using torches and creating dark den spaces, stretching our children's understanding of these concepts.

•31 October ~ **Halloween** party with a spooky buffet. We look forward to welcoming little monsters as the children can come dressed up if they wish to do so!

Children will be exploring sensory activities, discovering textures and materials using their senses by carving pumpkins feeling the textures of the inside of a pumpkin, creating small world scenes and baking pumpkin cakes.

These themes and events will enhance the children's awareness of colours as we transition through this autumn season noticing the leaves change colour. It is so beautiful and fascinating to see change in nature, allowing our children to be able to define these changes as they understand the world around them.
